What is a non-disabled On Point Foundation Volunteer Athlete?

A non-disabled On Point Foundation Volunteer Athlete is someone who already or plans on competing in any type of athletic event and now helps support On Point Foundation's cause of taking disabled service members from "Front Line to Finish Line."

How does an On Point Foundation Volunteer Athlete support the cause?

A volunteer athlete promotes On Point Foundation by doing exactly what they are already doing; racing or participating in events, but using the team name ImONPoint.org – "What Ever". On Point Foundation founder Arlen Jacob races as ImONPoint.org – Loose Screws, because he has 6 titanium screws in his lower spine.

How do you promote On Point Foundation Volunteer Athlete's races and events?

We have a great website where we create a profile with your bio and allow you access it to change. It is a blog, so you can leave posts about your races, reviews about gear, and pictures so others can follow your progress. We also have a forum where you can post questions and other racers in your field can help you out.

Does it cost money to join?

Quite the opposite, every volunteer receives our corporate discounts from our sponsors. You could actually save money. More sponsors are coming on board as we continue to grow. We span nation wide so if there are no discounts in your area, tell us and we will try to find local shops to support our cause. We do ask that each volunteer purchase a racing jersey. It is hard to race as a team if we do not look like a team. On Point Foundation does not make any money on the purchase, we only cover our costs. If you cannot purchase a jersey today, no problem, just get one when you can.

Do I have to raise money for the foundation?

Each volunteer athlete pledges to raise \$1000 each year. This is a good faith pledge with no contract, but helping disabled service members is our goal and cannot be accomplished without donations. You are given your own donation page on our website so people can attribute their donation directly to you.

What if there is not an On Point Foundation chapter in my area?

On Point Foundation is about taking charge and making a difference. If there is not a local chapter near you, then contact us about starting your own. More and more On Point Foundation chapters are starting around the U.S. all the time.

What if I want to do more with On Point Foundation?

There are many volunteer opportunities at On Point Foundation. In the athletic arena coaching, training, and working or racing with disabled service members is always needed. Not a racer and do not compete, we can use you also.
